

Roy was one of those wonderful, humorous guys who came into this world in the midst of a whole bunch of girls. He always laughed about not having to stand up for himself because Vivian and Anna took care of any problems which might come his way.

Vivian and Anna were older and June, Betty and Leah were younger. For all practical purposes for many years he was the only boy.

Roy loved life and all it had to offer. When he was very young they lived on Warren Avenue close to the Airport. Aviation was in its infancy and Roy was fascinated with all the stunt fliers who came in and out of the airport. The hangers in the early twenties were just sheds and he would climb up on the shed and watch the planes go thru their many stunts. One time he fell off the roof and broke his arm but this didn't stop his fascination. Only after one of the pilots decided this kid needed to go up in a flight which included many loops and rolls did he end his fascination. He said he was very sick and mother was very upset and he wasn't sure which was worse.

When he graduated from High School, Roy and a couple of buddies decided to take their music on the road and make their fortune. He laughed at how they wound up playing for a tent preacher who drank all day and preached at night. He said their biggest job was to make sure the guy was awake and sober in time to preach. All in all it was quite an education and he was happy to come home.

Roy attended the University of Wyoming and while he was there he had a dance band, The "Collegians." Their band was very popular and they played for all the University dances plus many others.

Music was Roy's natural talent. He could play nearly all the instruments in the band. He joined the National Guard long before he was old enough, just so he could play in the band. In 1940 they were activated and sent to Fort Lewis, Washington. He served there during World War II. They played many USO and other events for the military. He was back up for Jack Benny's road show as well as many other super stars of that day.

While Roy was stationed in Washington, he met and married the love of his life, Alice Louise Denton. They were married on April 4, 1942 and celebrated their 63rd anniversary this year. All thru their marriage, Roy and Alice lived in Oregon. There are three children; Denny, Rosemary and Richard and four grandchildren; Matt, Leta, Kirk and Brent. Leta is married to Chris Tabish and they have Roy and Alice's great grandchild, Jack Tabish. His grandchildren and little Jack were his pride and joy.

Roy never missed one of his grandchildren's school events — sporting, musical or whatever they did. In 2000, while Kirk and Brent were in highschool, he was honored by the school at a basketball game for being their best fan and presented the game ball. Roy loved being given this honor. Kirk is caddying for Ryan Moore, the Amateur Golf Champion. He loved the TV tournaments and Alice taped them. One day when Ryan was playing in the Amateur Championship, Roy called our house to talk to Bob and tell him to quick turn on the TV to the game and see Kirk. This weekend Kirk will once again be caddying for Ryan as they play in the PGA. He will be wearing McNary Golf hats with "Thanks a million" written on them. Thanks a million was Roy's favorite expression.

We will miss Roy, miss his ready smile and funny comments. His family will miss him as their husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather. What a shame little Jack will never get to know this man who loved him so much. We know Leta and Chris will tell him often, he won't be forgotten. He will certainly never be far from our memories
